


# Organisation Structure of N.T.S.Samiti

## **Service Rules, Policies and Procedures:**

The institution has its own service norms, regulations, and processes for effective operation, which are implemented by the UGC & Higher Education Department, KCSSR Government of Karnataka.

## **Recruitment of Faculty/Supporting Staff:**

• Advertisements are published in local and state-level newspapers.

- Interviews are conducted by a panel consisting of the government nominee, the university nominee, senior faculty or head of the department, an external subject expert from another university, the principal, and the chairman.
- Preference is given to relevant highest qualifications, teaching, and research experience as prescribed by the department.
- A demonstration is taken from each person to understand the teaching capabilities and competencies.
- The guidelines of the Govt. of Karnataka and the university are followed during the recruitment of the faculty.

Promotional Policies Based on the staff's (eligible) performance appraisal, they are promoted to higher levels. Qualification, eligibility, and salary structure are those of the Higher Education Department and as per university norms.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the provisor to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Karnatakahere by makes the following rules, namely:
